He has represented plaintiffs in environmental class actions, citizen suits under the Clean Water Act (CWA) and Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) and potentially responsible parties in cost recovery, contribution, and natural resource damage actions under the Comprehensive Environmental Response Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA). He has assisted clients with pre- and post-development environmental permitting and compliance with a particular focus on water quality compliance.

Fritz's litigation practice has heavily emphasized environmental litigation but also extends to construction defect litigation, homeowners and homeowners associations, commercial litigation, and insurance coverage disputes. He has argued appeals before the Colorado Supreme Court, Colorado Court of Appeals, and the United States Court of Appeals for the Tenth Circuit.
